How the Apostles Died

James the leader of the church in Jerusalem, what's strong over 100 feet down from the southeast pinnacle of the Temple when he refused to deny his faith in Christ. When they discovered that he survived the fall, his enemies beat James to death with a fuller's club. *This was the same pinnacle where Satan had taken Jesus during the temptations.

James the son of Zebedee:

was the fisherman by trade when Jesus called him to a lifetime of ministry, as a strong leader of the church, James was beheaded at Jerusalem. The Roman officer who guarded James watched amazed as James defernded his faith at his trial. Later, the officeer walked beside James to the place of execution. Overcome by conviction, he declared his new faith to the judge and knelt beside James to accept beheading as a Christian.
