Bartholomew: Also known as
Nathaniel was a missionary to
Asia. He witnessed for our Lord
in present day Turkey.
Bartholomew was martyred for
his preaching in Armenia where
he was flailed to death by a whip

Andrew was crucified on an X
shaped cross in Patras Greece.
After being whipped severely by
seven soldiers they tied his body
to the cross with cords to prolong
his agony. His followers reported
that, when he was led towards
the cross, Andrew saluted it in
these words: "I have long desired
and expected this happy hour.
The cross has been consecrated
by the body of Christ hanging on
it." He continued to preach to his
tormentors for two days until he
expired
